

AUSTRALIAN ENUM TRIAL – Registrar Requirements

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1.0 Background

This document sets out the policy rules that govern the obligations and requirements of accredited Registrars in the Australian ENUM trial. As a condition of accreditation, during the trial period Registrars must comply with all relevant ACA Published Policies for the trial in addition to the requirements of the Registry – See the Registrar Agreement with AusRegistry International.

ACA Published Policies in respect of the ENUM trial will be amended and varied from time to time in line with developments and experiences during the trial. All ACA Published Policies are available on the ENUM page of the ACA website and can also be accessed from the Registrar page of the ENUM trial website www.enum.com.au/links.htm. In addition, both the ACA and AusRegistry International will endeavour to keep accredited Registrars informed in advance of any changes to existing Published Policies or the creation of new Published Policies during the trial period.

2.0 Disclosure of information to Registrants

- 2.1 Registrars must notify Registrants that any contact information provided for the inclusion in ENUM NAPTR records will be stored in the publicly accessible Domain Name System and as such can be accessed and viewed by all other ENUM users.
- 2.2 In relation to information collected for whois, Registrars must inform Registrants that the Technical Contact may be a role rather than a personal identifier and that if a personal identifier is included it will be disclosed to the general public via a whois query. In addition, Registrars must also inform Registrants that the minimum contact details required for a Technical Contact is an email address only.

3.0 Trial Disclaimer

- 3.1 Registrars must include the following disclaimer in any ENUM domain name application or Registrant agreement:

DISCLAIMER: The registration of an ENUM domain name is offered in conjunction with the Australian ENUM trial, planned to run for 12 months from 6 June 2005 with the possibility of extension for up to a further 12 months. There is no guarantee that the trial will be extended beyond the initial 12 month period or that a commercial public ENUM service will be established

following the conclusion of the trial. Without prejudice to decisions that may be taken at the conclusion of the trial, all ENUM-only numbers in the 059 range are expected to be surrendered to the ACA at the conclusion of the trial, with the consequence that Registrants would not retain any rights of use in relation to those numbers.

4.0 Registrant Warranty

- 4.1** Registrants must warrant that all information supplied for the purposes of registering an ENUM domain name is truthful and correct. As such, Registrars must include the following warranty statement on all ENUM domain name applications and renewal forms:

IMPORTANT NOTICE: By submitting this application for an ENUM domain name you confirm that all information supplied is truthful and correct and is not misleading in any way. If any of the information is subsequently found to be untrue, or is incomplete, incorrect or misleading in any way, or if you have submitted this application in bad faith, the ENUM domain name licence can be cancelled and you will permanently lose your right to use the ENUM domain name with which you have been issued.
