

## Formal Warning under subsection 129(2) of the Telecommunications Act 1997

and Media Authority

TO: Intelico Pty Ltd (ACN 158 184 957)

OF: 45 John Dalley Drive Helensvale, QLD 4212

The Australian Communications and Media Authority (the **ACMA**) is satisfied that Intelico Pty Ltd (ACN 158 184 957) (**Intelico**) has contravened the *Telecommunications (Consumer Complaints Handling) Industry Standard 2018* (the **Complaints Standard**) as described below; and

HEREBY issues a formal warning to Intelico under subsection 129(2) of the *Telecommunications Act 1997* (the **Act**) for contravening paragraph 7(1)(a) of the Complaints Standard.

## Details of the contravention

- 1. The ACMA has investigated whether Intelico's complaints handling process (**CHP**) complied with the minimum requirements for consumer complaints handling set out in sections 8, 9 and 10 of the Complaints Standard.
- 2. As a carriage service provider, Intelico is a participant in the section of the telecommunications industry to which the Complaints Standard applies and is required to comply with the Complaints Standard under subsection 128(1) of the Act.
- 3. After completing its investigation, the ACMA is satisfied that as at 1 August 2018, Intelico's CHP did not comply with:
  - a. paragraph 8(1)(b);
  - b. paragraph 8(1)(f);
  - c. paragraph 8(1)(g);
  - d. paragraph 8(1)(h);
  - e. paragraph 8(1)(k);
  - f. paragraph 8(1)(l);
  - g. paragraph 8(1)(m);
  - h. section 9
  - i. paragraph 10(a);
  - j. paragraph 10(b);

- k. paragraph 10(c);
- I. paragraph 10(d);
- m. paragraph 10(f); and
- n. paragraph 10(g)

of the Complaints Standard.

4. Accordingly, the ACMA finds that Intelico contravened paragraph 7(1)(a) of the Complaints Standard on 1 August 2018, by not establishing a CHP that includes the minimum requirements for consumer complaints handling.
