
Under section 67 of the BSA (Applications for prior approval of temporary breaches) a person may, before a transaction takes place or an agreement is entered into that would place a person in breach of a provision of Division 2 (Limitation on control) or 3 (Limitation on directorships), make an application to the ACMA for an approval of the breach.

Under section 68 of the BSA (Extensions of time for compliance with a notice issued under section 67) a person who has been given a notice under section 67 of the BSA may, within three months before the end of the period specified in the notice, apply in writing to ACMA for an extension of that period.

Under section 70 of the BSA, if the ACMA is satisfied that a person is in breach of a provision of Division 2 or 3, the ACMA may by notice in writing given to the person direct that person to take action so that the person is no longer in breach of that provision.

Under section 71 of the BSA, a person who was given a notice under section 70 may, within 3 months before the end of a period specified in the notice may apply in writing to the ACMA for an extension of that period.

ACMA is required to maintain a public register of these matters under section 75 of the BSA.

1. In terms of subsection 70(1) of the Broadcasting Services Act 1992 (the Act) the Australian Broadcasting Authority (the ABA) is satisfied that NMH is in breach of subsection 57(3) of the Act by virtue of being satisfied that:

a) NMH is a "foreign person" within the terms of section 6 of the Act because;

(i) AXA Societe Anonyme (AXA) is a "foreign person" within the terms of section 6 of the Act; and

(ii) AXA by its subscription of shares in NMH, obtained a company interest in NMH which exceeds 50%;

b) NMH has a company interest in commercial television broadcasting licensees, Amalgamated Television Services Pty Ltd, Brisbane TV Limited, HSV Channel 7 Pty Ltd, South Australian Telecasters Limited and TVW Enterprises Ltd (the licensees);

c) As a result of the subscription of shares by AXA in NMH, 2 or more foreign persons, have company interests that exceed 20%;

2. In terms of sub-section 70(7) is satisfied that the circumstances in which the breach has occurred are circumstances other than where the breach has been caused as a result of the action of persons other than AXA and NMH;

3. Pursuant to section 70 of the Act, the ABA, directs that within six months of the date of this notice, NMH take action so that it is no longer in breach of subsection 57(3) of the Act; and

4. The ABA directs NMH's attention to section 72 of the Act. Failure to comply with this notice may result in NMH being prosecuted for a breach of section 72 of the Act.
