4) Witnessing the statutory declaration overseas

You are able to witness Commonwealth statutory declarations overseas if you:

- a) Fall within one of the categories on the list above and have a connection to Australia,
- b) Are a notary public appointed overseas;
- c) Are an employee of the Australian Trade and Investment Commission who is: (i) in a country or place outside Australia, (ii) authorised under paragraph 3(d) of the *Consular Fees Act 1955* and (iii) exercising your function in that place;
- d) Are an employee of the Commonwealth who is (i) in a country or place outside Australia, (ii) authorised under paragraph 3(c) of the *Consular Fees Act 1955* and (iii) exercising your function in that place.

For example, a member of a police force in Australia may witness a Commonwealth statutory declaration overseas. However, a police officer of a foreign police force cannot witness a Commonwealth statutory declaration. An approved witness may also be found at an Australian Embassy, High Commission or Consulate.
