Not formal separate ones - it would be unusual for the CSPs on the drafting committee to provide submissions to Comms Alliance public consultation Codes.

However, as part of the DC they have directly entered comments into the comment log. We are working through these concerns along with all the other stakeholder comments. You will of course see this log when we submit (I am not sure how viable it would be to pull them out in a usable form at this stage to send them to you, but let me know if that's a major issue).

Note that:

(1) their comments at this stage are predominantly related to drafting issues picked up by the businesses on review, implementation concerns (e.g. delayed clauses) and other implementation practicalities (some of which are quite fundamental).

(2) many other concerns have been aired previously* and although concerns remain, they will likely be:

- a. the issues that have been clearly identified as 'non-negotiable'; or
- b. issues which the DC considered, on balance, to be reasonably dealt with through drafting. (i.e. reflecting the fact that the DC has been tasked to walk the fine line on this code, and has clear direction on many of the issues from the RC or ACMA that other stakeholders may not be aware of, despite the multi-step, transparent process)

*i.e. throughout this iterative review process. They are documented in the various submission logs, marked-up draft, issues/position papers, RC minutes, correspondence, etc. Most of this is on our website, with additional detail provided to the RC and ACMA.
