**RE: Remaking the low interference potential devices (LIPD) class licence – consultation**

Thank you for the opportunity to make this submission regarding the remaking the Low Interference Potential Devices (LIPD) Class Licence, May 2025 .

TPG Telecom wish to fully endorse the submission made by AMTA in this matter.

TPG Telecom believe the Upper 6 GHz presents the best opportunity to forestall capacity constraints for mobile services in Australia.

TPG Telecom urges caution against prematurely allocating the 6425–6585 MHz band to RLAN in 2025, citing two key concerns. The risk of locking Australia into a frequency range unsupported by a global device ecosystem. Leading to costly, custom solutions. Secondly, the absence of international studies or domestic consultation on adjacent-band coexistence. Without clear compatibility requirements, existing RLAN devices could interfere with nearby Wireless Broadband networks.

TPG Telecom recommends delaying RLAN deployment in this band until coexistence issues are fully examined and the international market has further developed, to ensure optimal public benefit from this valuable spectrum.
