Varying the Griffith and MIA TLAP

Brendon Agpasa welcomes the opportunity to respond to the "Varying the Griffith and MIA TLAP" consultation paper.

We propose to vary the Griffith and MIA TLAP to allocate broadcasting licences for the three commercial television broadcasting services currently provided by WIN Television Griffith Pty Ltd (Nine, Seven, and Ten).

We would like to allocate channels to WIN Television so that it can transmit services under two of its TV broadcasting licences on the same set of transmitters. WIN would use the freed-up capacity to combine its Seven, Nine, and Ten channels onto a single multiplex, while retaining their individual affiliations with the Seven Network, Nine Network, and Network 10. Additionally, WIN would add the multichannel 7Flix to its suite of digital TV channels (Seven, 7Two, 7Mate, Nine, 9Gem, 9Go!, 9Life, WIN Gold, 10, 10 Drama, and 10 Comedy). Under these expanded television channel changes, we need to accommodate the new TV channel, 7Flix, from the Seven Network TV services added to WIN TV in Griffith and MIA, which covers parts of regional New South Wales.

We request that the Griffith and MIA TLAP be varied to allocate channels to WIN Television for the transmitters that will transmit the combined broadcast signals of Seven, Nine, and Ten stations on the same set of transmitters. This includes MTN29 in Griffith and MTN43 in Hay, where the channels would be consolidated. We propose to proceed with making the transmitter consolidation declarations once WIN begins transmitting programming from all the TV channels of the Seven Network, Nine Network, and Network 10 under the shared transmission multiplex.


The Australian Communications and Media Authority (ACMA) has approved the transfer of Seven, Nine, and Ten stations under single TV licences from WIN Television Griffith to Nine Entertainment Company.

The ACMA is requesting approval for commercial television broadcasting licences to transmit Seven, Nine, and Ten stations terrestrially in Griffith on UHF channel 29 and in Hay on UHF channel 43, under the proposed consolidation. Additionally, UHF channels 32 in Griffith and 44 in Hay will be surrendered.

We also need to consider the Seven Network and Network Ten television services provided terrestrially in the Griffith and MIA TV1 licence area, in line with the transmitter consolidation declarations under paragraphs 3(1)(a) and 3(1)(b) of the BSA. We must declare the Griffith and MIA TV1 licence area as the region that will receive free-to-air digital TV channels from the Seven and Ten networks via the WIN Television network.

Upon successful completion of the Griffith and MIA TV1 licence area changes, viewers in these areas will be able to access TV channels from the Seven Network and Network Ten via terrestrial Freeview services.
