Community broadcasting services

 - be a company that is formed in Australia or in an external territory
 - represent a community interest.
- Schedule 2 of the *Broadcasting Services Act 1992* sets out the standard conditions applicable to community radio broadcasting licences.

- Complete all questions. An incomplete application may delay assessment.
- Giving the ACMA false or misleading information – including omission of information – is a serious offence under subsection 137.1(1) of the Criminal Code.
