Thank you for contacting us to raise your concerns about the promotion of gambling services on the Tasmanian Times. We appreciate the considerable effort you have taken to compile the substantial information provided which has assisted the ACMA's consideration of the matters you have raised.

As you are aware, the ACMA enforces the *Interactive Gambling Act 2001* (IGA) which prohibits certain online gambling services from being provided or advertised to Australians. This includes prohibited interactive gambling services, such as online casinos.

We have engaged with the provider of the Tasmanian Times which we understand is under new management. They have indicated their commitment to achieving ongoing compliance with the IGA.

We have reviewed the Tasmanian Times website and it appears that most content promoting prohibited interactive gambling services has been removed.

Given this, the ACMA will not be taking any further action in relation to the Tasmanian Times at present. However, the ACMA will continue to monitor the Tasmanian Times website, and action may be taken in the future in respect of any contraventions of the IGA.
